Everything's Gonna Be OK Little Kitties:

My wife DJ wrote this out loud on the way back from taking all three cats to the vet for their yearly checkups.

We take turns doing it. It was her turn, and as always when we take them to the vet, the kitties were meowing loudly in protest at leaving the nest.

So she made up this song to entertain them. It worked, they stopped yowling and listened to her.

When she got home, she sang it for me and was surprised that I thought it was so good I wanted her to record it immediately.

I almost think it's the perfect country song, even though it doesn't mention trains, drinking, prison, or rain. It does mention momma.

Mainly, it's just pure, beautiful, written for the love of singing, not for a commercial audience, and is short and sweet, but tells a story.

THAT makes it the perfect country song.

She Only Listens to Songs by Dead Singers

This song uses a technique called <u>Xenochrony</u>, which was pioneered by Frank Zappa.

Xenochrony is taking a solo from one song and transplanting it into another song, often with unexpected but pleasing results.

She Only Listens to Songs by Dead Singers borrows the guitar solo from Sky Funeral for a Respected Cor Anglais Player, on this same album.

The solo is still in that song, but I copied it to *She Only Listens to Songs by Dead Singers* and assigned it to two synths playing in unison.
